Favorites

Favorites are photos by other people that you want to bookmark in Flickr, so they are easy to find later. You can add any photo that you can view to your favorites. There is no limit on the number of favorites you can have.



When you are looking at a photo's individual page, you will see a button on the left hand side of the photo which reads 'Add to favorites'. Just click on that.

How do I upload my photos?

- You can send your photos in via email. Everyone is provided with their own email addresses to upload your photos to your Flickr photostream
- You can use a web form to upload up to six photos at a time from the upload page. To access this upload form, look in the navigation menu at the top under "You".

Privacy

Every photo comes with its own privacy settings.

- Public** - a photo available to everyone (That's, and includes people visiting the site who aren't members)
- Group Private** - Only make it visible to people who are your friends, just to your family, to both your friends and family,
- Private** - you can keep an image completely.

Tags

What are tags?

You can give your photos a "tag", which is like a keyword or category label. Tags help you find photos which have something in common. You can assign as many tags as you wish to each photo.

To understand tags look at the size of the word; the larger the word the more people have used it for their descriptions

Rotation

account / Auto-rotate

Shall we rotate your photos as you upload them?

Yes please, that would be lovely.

Auto-rotation is only possible if the files you upload contain usable orientation information.

Please note that the original version of your photo will be stored without being rotated, but all the other sizes of your photo will be rotated automatically.

Accounts

There are two types of accounts, start with the free one and if you like it go for the Pro

Free Account:

- 20 MB monthly upload limit
- 3 photosets
- Photostream views limited to the 200 most recent images
- Storage of smaller (resized) images

Pro Account for \$24.95 a year.

- 2 GB monthly upload limit
- Unlimited storage
- Unlimited bandwidth
- Unlimited photosets
- Permanent archiving of high-resolution original images
- The ability to replace a photo
- Ad-free browsing and sharing

Sharing Photos

How do I share my photos with people?

People who pop by to visit Flickr will be able to see your public photos. Here are some other ways to share:

- You can blog any of your own public photos
- You can set up your own Flickr web address (like <http://www.flickr.com/photos/george/>), and share it with all your friends,
- You can send individual photos to people, either as attachments to an email, or by sending them a link to a page on Flickr
- You can make a Flickr badge, and put it on your own website.

Protecting your Photos



Protecting your photos may be important to you. If so you could apply for copyright but Flickr uses Creative Commons that uses four types of copyright



Attribution means:

You let others copy, distribute, display, and perform your copyrighted work - and derivative works based upon it - but only if they give you credit.

Noncommercial means:

You let others copy, distribute, display, and perform your work - and derivative works based upon it - but for noncommercial purposes only.

No Derivative Works means:

You let others copy, distribute, display, and perform only verbatim copies of your work, not derivative works based upon it.

Share Alike means:

You allow others to distribute derivative works only under a license identical to the license that governs your work.

Extras for Photos

Any time you publish a photo in Flickr, it will inherit the default level of privacy you set here. This setting applies to photos you upload by email as well.

Note: If you add a photo to a group pool, that group's members will be able to view and add notes, comments or tags to that photo, regardless of the photo's privacy settings.
