HISTORICAL NOTE

Chartered by the General Assembly of the State of Rhode Island and Providence Plantations in 1875, the Providence Public Library (PPL) is a privately governed and support library with a public library mission.

The PPL opened in 1878 on the second floor of the Butler Exchange building in Exchange Place. In 1880, it moved to a larger, street level location on Snow Street below the Mowry and Goff School. The Library quickly required more space and in 1896 ground was broken for the Renaissance building at 225 Washington Street. The building was made possible by a large gift from John Nicholas Brown.

The branch library system was begun in 1928 with the construction of the first branch library in Wanskuck. Over the next three decades additional branches were created including Rochambeau, Smith Hill, South Providence, Mount Pleasant, Olneyville, Tockwotton, Washington Park and a Business Branch downtown. In 1954 an addition to the central library on Washington Street was added enlarging the building to take over the entire block between Empire and Greene Streets. In 2009, the City of Providence assumed responsibility for the branch libraries and formed the Providence Community Libraries.

Since 1877, the PPL has had only seven library directors including William E. Foster (served 1877-1930), Clarence E. Sherman (served 1930-1957), Stuart C. Sherman (served 1957-1967), F. Charles Taylor (served 1968-1978), Annalee Bundy (served 1978-1988), Dale Thompson (served 1988-2014) and H. Jack Martin (served 2014 to present).

SCOPE AND CONTENTS OF THE COLLECTION

The collection contains photographs of the Providence Public Library and includes images of the buildings, staff and programs. The bulk of the collection includes images of the building and staff of the Washington Street / Empire Street library (aka Central Branch). Also included are images of various branches, architectural drawings, negative and clippings.

ORGANIZATION OF THE COLLECTION

The collection is organized into five series: Central Branch, Branch Libraries, Miscellaneous images, Photograph Albums and Oversized prints. Series I related to the Central Branch is further subdivided into sub-series including Exterior architectural images, Interior architectural images and Programs & staff. Items are organized chronologically at the folder level.

DETAILED DESCRIPTION OF THE COLLECTION

Series I – Providence Public Library, Central branch

Includes photographs and clippings of the main building of the Providence Public Library. Prior to the construction of the current building on Washington Street, the PPL was housed for several years in the Butler Exchange building in Exchange Place and then later on Snow Street. In 1898, construction was completed for the main building on 225 Washington Street. In 1953, an addition to the building extended the library on to Empire Street, thereby taking over the whole corner of the intersection.
